## NATIONAL CORRESPONDENTS

**I**n the Bye-Laws of the IAS, the National Correspondents are defined as follows:

"Each country with more than five Members or countries decided by the Bureau will have a National Correspondent, appointed by the President after recommendation by the Bureau in consultations with the country's sedimentological group, where existing. National Correspondents must be paid-up Members of the Association. They will inform the General Secretary of sedimentological activities and assist in obtaining Members within their particular country. The term of National Correspondents will terminate at each International Congress and normally they will be eligible for reappointment for one additional period of office only".

Many countries do not yet have a representative. In most cases, these countries have only a few IAS members who, however, may be very active. A National Correspondent there could serve as a **nucleus** and stimulate the formation of a local sedimentology group. Otherwise, contacts with a neighbouring country could be established.

In countries with only a small sedimentological community, National Correspondents have a very important role to play. They are

**catalysts** for sedimentological activities such as local meetings, workshops, and field trips. They should send **regular reports** on what is happening in their country to be published in the IAS Newsletter. This is especially essential for countries which lie off the path of big international congresses and which are not easily visited by other sedimentologists.

National Correspondents in countries with a strong sedimentological community have a different significance. The activities there are regulated through national and international meetings, and exchange with the outside world generally is no problem. These correspondents can contribute through the organization of **regional and/or thematic meetings and workshops**. Reports on such activities will be published in the Newsletter.

National Correspondents are contact persons between the IAS Bureau and their community. It is up to them to nominate candidates for the **friendship scheme** (by which the membership fees of a not-so-rich student are paid for by a richer "godparent"). They can announce that they want to **donate sedimentology books** they don't need anymore, and they can state if **their library needs textbooks**. They can also invite a **Special**

**Lecturer** and organize his stay when he tours their continent or country.

The IAS does not only want to publish good science in its journal, but also wishes to promote sedimentology throughout the world. Sedimentology is a basic science which needs good outcrops and good people to describe and interpret them. Sedimentology is both an environmental and a technical science

when it comes to coping with the increasing conflicts between Nature and Man. These scientific and practical issues are important in **every country** on our planet, and this is why **National Correspondents are vital** for the better functioning and the success of the IAS.

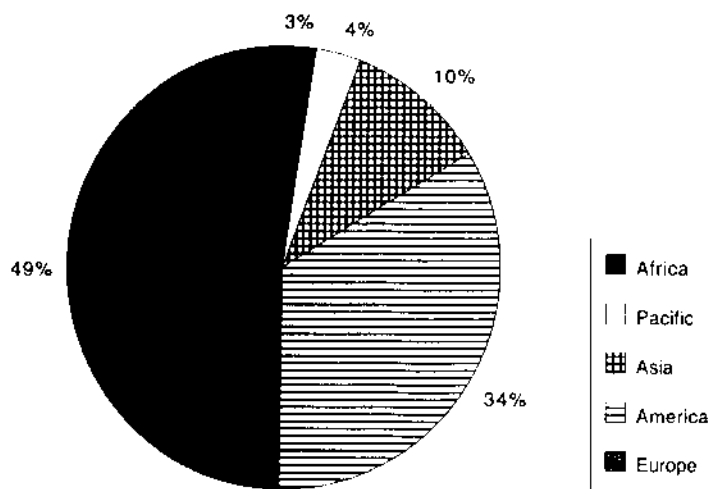

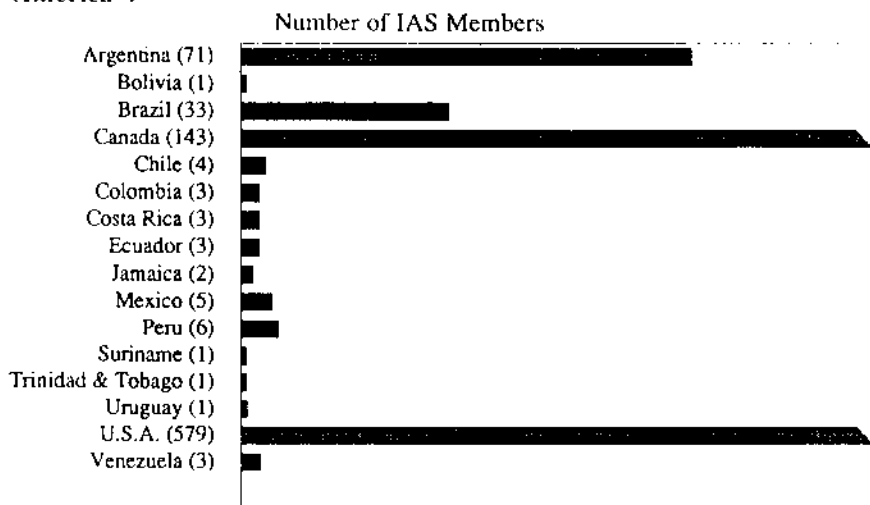

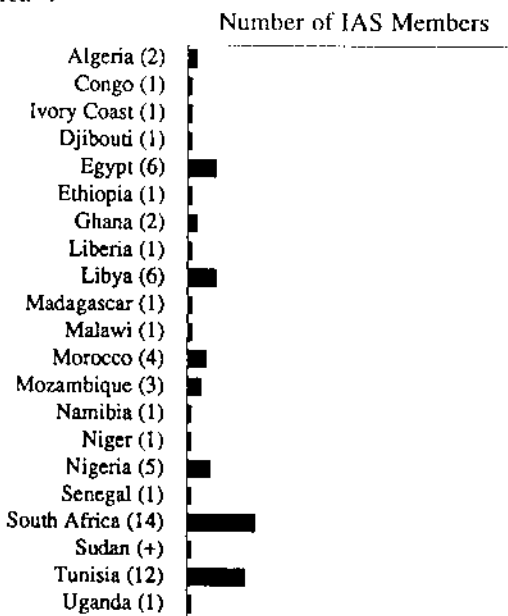
### General Worldwide Distribution :



## America :

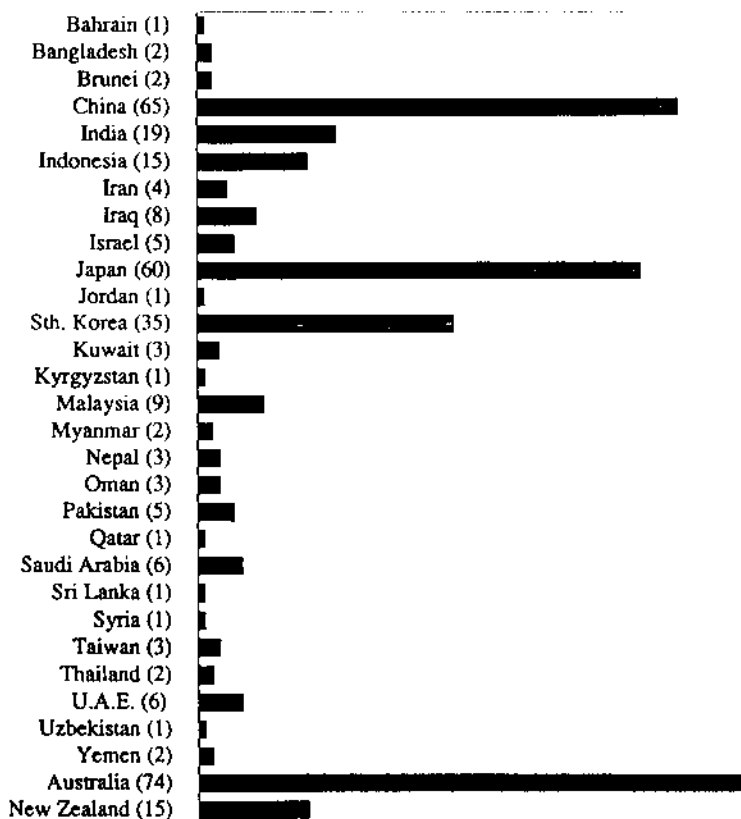


## Africa :

**INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF SEDIMENTOLOGISTS (IAS)****NEW MEMBERS**

**T**he International Association of Sedimentologists was founded in 1952, with the goal to promote the study of sedimentology. It counts over 2500 members from 97 countries. The journal *Sedimentology* has six issues per year, comprising about 1200 pages. Special Publications appear at irregular intervals. Every year, a Regional Meeting is held in Europe or North Africa, and an International Sedimentological Congress takes place every four years.

Special Lecture Tours are organized, allowing sedimentology groups to invite a well-known teacher to their country to give talks and short courses. The Friendship Scheme gives free membership to students in less-developed countries. IAS also maintains a network of National Correspondents, who report on the activities in their countries.

Fees amount to 180 FF (US \$34) a year for full members, and 90 FF (US \$17) for student members. This includes receipt of the journal *Sedimentology* and the Newsletter, reduced prices for the Special Publications, and reduced registration fees for the Congresses and Meetings.

### THIRD IAS SPECIAL LECTURE TOUR

Following the very successful tours of Special Lecturers Robin Bathurst in 1992 and John Crowell in 1993/94 (see reports in Newsletters No. 125, 132, and 134/135), the IAS Bureau can now present the third Special Lecturer, **Prof. Dr. Emiliano Mutti**.

Prof. Mutti of the University of Parma, Italy, is well known for his research in turbidites. Together with F. Ricci Lucchi he established the most widely used facies classification of deep-water siliciclastic sedimentary systems, but also dealt with most other types of sandstone facies and the processes they are related to. He has led innumerable fieldtrips and workshops for universities and oil companies and is well known for his clear and precise style of presentation.

Prof. Mutti proposes two themes on which he will lecture:

1. **Facies analysis of turbidite systems (basic concepts).**
2. **Flood-generated sandstone facies in ancient fluvio-deltaic systems (top-level science).**

He can give his talks in English, French, Spanish, or

(naturally) Italian. The lectures can be completed by round-table discussions and illustrated by local field trips. The Lecture Tour is planned for 1996.

Sedimentology groups and Institutes throughout the world which are interested in receiving Prof. Mutti should **apply as soon as possible, but not later than July 1st, 1995**, mentioning the preferred time of the visit. A travel plan will then be established in the most convenient way. Priority is given to institutions in countries which normally don't have the means to invite foreign lecturers.

The IAS finances the travel expenses to and from the visited country, but local expenses for food and lodging as well as for local field trips have to be paid by the host institutions.

## NEWS FROM THE NETHERLANDS

Within the framework of the government's policy to concentrate research funding on a limited number of "centres of excellence", two research schools, in which sedimentology plays an important role, were recognised by the Royal Netherlands Academy of Arts and Sciences during 1994.

The "Centre for Technical Geoscience" (CTG) of Delft Technological University stimulates the interaction of geophysical imaging, geological characterisation and underground engineering. The research carried out in the Applied Sedimentology section of the Faculty of Mining and Petroleum Engineering has been incorporated into the new research school. The section has at the moment seven Ph.D. students and eight staff members working on various geological reservoir characterisation topics. Quantitative data sets from outcrop analogues of aeolian, fluvial, shallow marine and deep water reservoirs are being collected

and geostatistically processed. Conceptual, physical and mathematical models are made. Various oil companies have supplied log, core and production data which are incorporated into these models.

Sedimentary geologists from the Free University of Amsterdam and the State University of Utrecht have established the "Netherlands Research School of Sedimentary Geology" (NSG). This school concentrates its research on sedimentary basins and the underlying lithosphere, and on palaeoenvironments and Earth system change. Both themes are central to a modern, process-oriented approach to earth sciences.

Both schools have recently organised a symposium on challenges for advanced training and research in which representatives of government, industry and universities participated.
